Ow (the pinch sound)

Ow has two sounds. The first sound is the sound you make when someone pinches you: "Ow!" It rhymes with cow. When you hear the ow sound at the end of the word, then write (ow). This can be used at the end of a root and before L, N, el, and er.

Cow how now plow vow bow pow wow allow brow chow cowboy eyebrow wow

Before an L owl fowl growl growling vowels scowl prowl towel vowel

Before a N down town gown frown brown clown crown drown

Before an er tower power shower pow/der flower chowder gun/pow/der

Ou (pinch sound used in the beginning or middle of words) Ouch out our flour about pouch couch grouch pout house mouse blouse loud cloud proud noun proudly shout trout scout sprout count snout south mouth round found ground sound sur/round/ed
