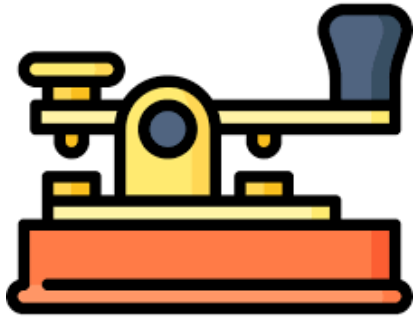

The De/vel/op/ment of Com/mu/ni/ca/tion



Years ago, people com/mu/nic/a/ted with each other mostly by writing letters. Then came the **tel/e/graph**. It allowed faster com/mu/nic/a/tion over long



dis/tan/ces by sending mes/sa/ges by Morse Code. After that, the **tel/e/phone**

was in/vent/ed. Sud/den/ly, people could hear their friends and talk with them in real time! People could have



tel/e/phones in their own homes! These new **phones** were con/nect/ed by wires.

Tel/e/phone poles carried the wires all over the coun/try. In order to place a call, a person would lift up the re/ceiv/er and wait for an op/er/a/tor. The op/er/a/tor would then con/nect the caller to the person they were calling.

The next ad/vance/ment was the a/bil/it/y to dial a family's **phone** number with your finger. Each house/hold had one **phone** and one **phone** number.



After that, cord/less **phones** were in/vent/ed. These **phones** al/lowed people to walk around while talking.

Finally, cell **phones** were in/vent/ed. Now, ev/er/y/one has their own **phone** and can take them with them wher/ev/er they go. They can call and text, take **photos**, send **photos**, have ap/point/ments with their **phy/si/cian**,



order items from the **phar/ma/cy**, learn **phonics**, and take classes in **phy/sics**, **phil/os/o/phy**, and **ge/o/graph/y**, all on their **phones**. They can read **Phil/ip/pi/ans** and other books in the Bible and learn about the **pro/phets**, **ser/a/phim**, **Pha/raoh** in Egypt, the **Phil/is/tines**, the disciple **Philip**, and the Church of **Phil/a/del/phi/a**. They can also use their **phones** to call a loved one and pray with them. **Phones** are

a tool that can be used by the servants of GOD to triumph over the enemy!
