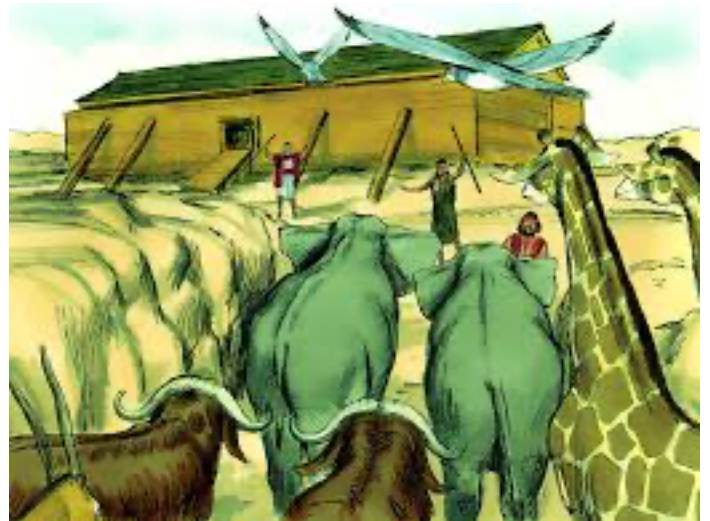


Lesson 67:

Pronouncing Names in the Bible, including the Twelve Apostles

There are many names in the Bible. The Bible is really our family's scrapbook, showcasing the stories of our ancestors and cousins on the earth. Did you know that we are all descended from Grandpa Adam and Grandma Eve? Our Grandpa Enoch "walked with GOD, and was not, for the LORD took him"! Then, Grandpa Noah is our ancestor who, with his three sons (our Grandpa and two Great Uncles) built the Ark and saved our whole family from the Flood! We have an amazing family – and we are all related!!! We're all cousins!!!!



Luke 3:23-38 traces the geneology of JESUS all the way back through King David, Judah, Abraham, Noah, Adam, and GOD. This passage and many others in the Bible contain Hebrew names that are unfamiliar to many people. So what do you do?

Well, the first thing to do when trying to pronounce these names is to use your phonics rules and sound the names out slowly, one syllable at a time. That is usually “good enough”. However, if you are going to use a name in a sermon or a speech, it is a good idea to look up the name in the Bible Concordance and see how the Hebrew or Greek Dictionary pronounces it. If you are still unsure, you can listen to a recording of someone reading that passage in the Bible, or you could ask a Bible Scholar. Remember that the saints are very forgiving. If, when you arrive in Heaven, you discover that you have been mispronouncing someone’s name incorrectly all your life, I’m sure the person will be very gracious about your error! So, do your best and don’t worry about little mispronunciations. Just keep trying!

READ THE GENEALOGY OF JESUS (Luke 3:23-38, New Living Translation). When reading this list, don't worry about perfection. Just sound out the names slowly, one syllable at a time. Try your best, but don't worry about messing up. Almost everyone struggles with these names! Also, note that from Noah back to GOD, we have the same genealogy as JESUS!):

Enosh was the son of Seth.
Seth was the son of Adam.
Adam was the son of God.

COMPREHENSION QUESTIONS:

1. In verse 23, how old was JESUS when He began His public ministry?
2. In verse 32, we read that one of JESUS' Great-grandfathers was David the son of Jesse. This was King David. GOD had said that the Messiah would be of the line of King David. Do you think this was important to the Jewish audience who was reading Matthew's Gospel?
3. In verse 36, Noah is named as one of JESUS' Great-grandfathers. He is also our Great-grandfather. What significant thing did Great-Grandpa Noah do?

PROJECT: In verse 38, Adam is said to be "the son of GOD". Therefore, every single human being on the face of the earth is a great-grandson or great-granddaughter of GOD!!!! That explains why JESUS instructs us to call GOD "our Father" in the LORD's Prayer. Take a few moments to pray this prayer (found in Matthew 6:9-13), focusing on GOD as our Heavenly Father:

⁹ ...Our Father which art in heaven, Hallowed be thy name.

¹⁰ Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done in earth, as it is in heaven.

¹¹ Give us this day our daily bread.

¹² And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors.

¹³ And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil: For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever. Amen.
