The **Con/stit/u/tion** is the **foun/da/tion** of the laws of our **nation**. It es/tab/lish/es three branches of gov/ern/ment. The **Con/stit/u/tion** is based on the Bib/lic/al pattern that GOD is our King, Law/giv/er, and Judge, and that all our free/doms and bless/ings come from GOD. Our Founding Fathers were **cau/tious** not to give too much power to any one of the three branches of gov/ern/ment. Part of our **ed/u/ca/tion** is to learn how our gov/ern/ment works. A person of any **oc/cu/pa/tion** may become a leader in our country. Leaders do not have to be **pol/i/ti/cians**. They may be **phy/si/cians**, **mu/si/cians**, **di/et/i/cians**, **tech/ni/cians**, or even **beau/ti/cians**. If you study hard, work hard, are honest, kind, have good char/ac/ter, and are willing to be the

servant of all, you could become a good leader some/day. You could have a **dis/cus/sion** about
