Lesson 37: Ow (the pinch sound)

Phonics Focus: Ow has two sounds. The first sound is the sound you make when someone pinches you: "Ow!" It rhymes with cow. When you hear the ow sound at the end of the word, then write (ow). This can be used at the end of a root and before L, N, el, and er:

Ow at the end of a root:

Before an L:

owl	growl	prowl
fowl	growling	towel

PROJECT:
